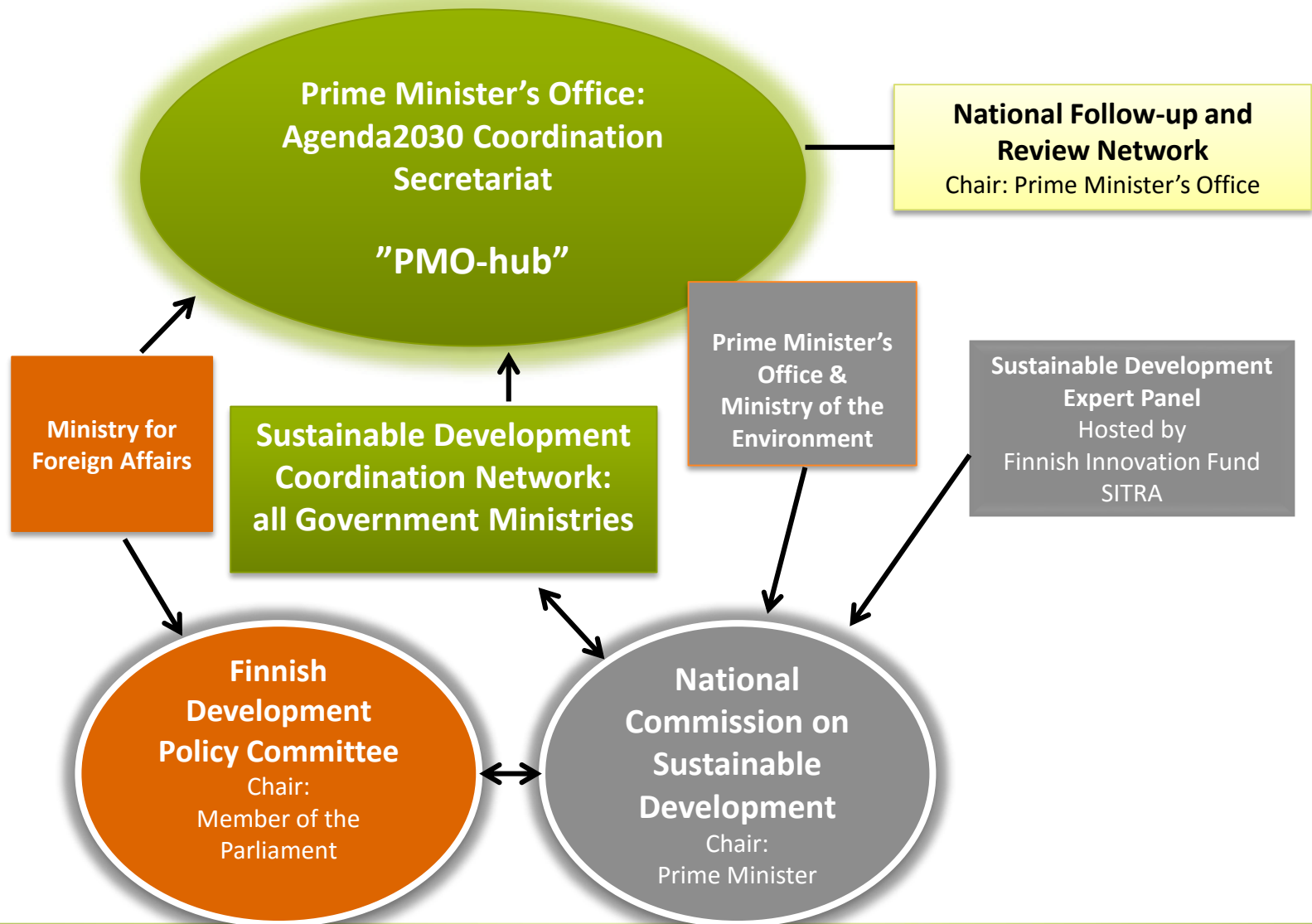

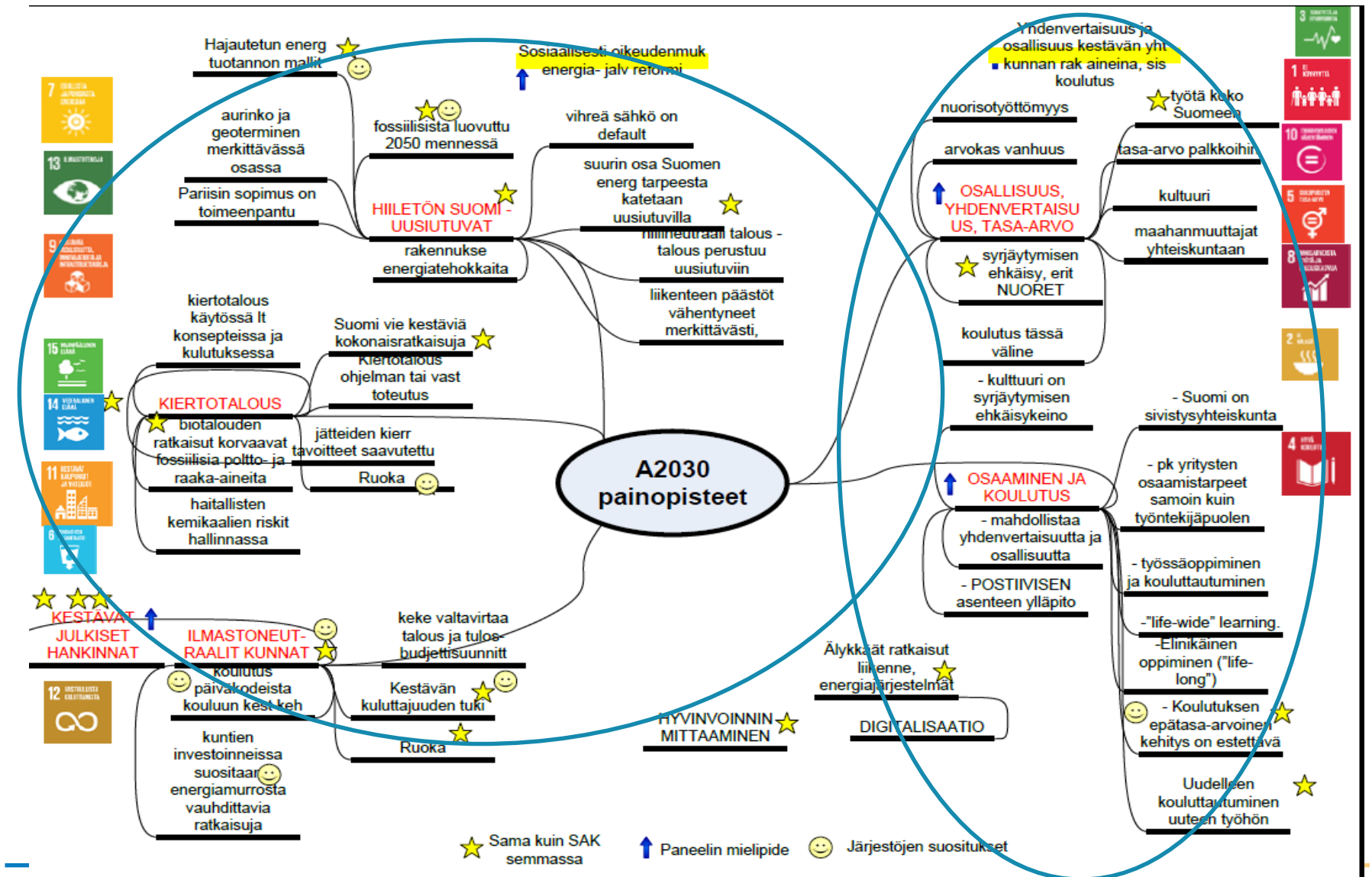

How to overcome conflicts of interest and deal with trade-offs?

- Build on scientific work but understand political realities
