


Figure 1. Overview of the Nordic countries' SDGs status reflecting that while countries are making progress, some stagnation can be observed in relation to several goals compared to previous years. Adapted from Sustainable Development Report 2022.

- Financed by Nordic Council of Ministers


Why? Share Nordic learnings with local governments worldwide Showcase the vital role of local level to reach SDGs & ignite more local action


Selected VSR survey results

Different response rates in the countries: from ca 30% in NO and FI to 99% in IS






Progress in the implementation of the SDGs

Nordic SDG governance challenges

- **Decline in use of SDGs as holistic** framework; **SDG fatigue** at different levels
- Limited government support in some countries: Political polarization led to reduction in budgets:
 - Sweden discontinued National Agenda 2030 Coordinator and 'Glocal Sweden' peer learning network that had just gained momentum
 - **Denmark:** KL shifts from SDGs to climate plans and actions Risk to divert resources
- Youth distrust politicians' ability to solve key problems; increasing inequalities
- Lack of resources, capacity & progress indicators hinder many municipalities
- Frequent shifts in political leadership locally >> Need to anchor the goals and host recurring SDG trainings
- Difficult to work holistically when national policies remain in silos



Learnings for national governments

- 1. Acknowledge global commitment to the SDGs: your role in the transition
- 2. Maintain SDGs as holistic framework for sustainability, uphold policy coherence and reduce any negative spill-overs
- 3. Strengthen role of LRGAs to offer peer learning: Copy with pride!
- 4. Consult regularly with LRGAs on policy measures and local needs
- 5. Continue effective **national support programmes** for municipalities
- 6. Support design of local-level indicators, data collection, and reporting
- 7. Include innovation and SDG targets in **public procurement guidelines**.
- 8. Encourage systematic engagement of youth, schools and civil society
- 9. Support VSRs and participation in international networks





QUESTION from LOCAL Level to panel:

What are you as national level representatives planning to do in concrete terms to further support and acknowledge the vital role of municipalities in the transition?

For example:

- targeted support programmes for green investments
- strengthen the role of LRGAs facilitating capacity building and peer learning for local administrators.
