




Structure of governance of the 2030 Agenda




Chart: Governance of the 2030 Agenda in Spain



SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT ACCELERATING POLICIES: accelerating policies are those that serve to draw in our country the horizon indicated in the 2030 Agenda, solving the major challenges identified. Therefore, by their own definition, they are not specific policies that cover some of the problems of each challenge, but rather they are a broad framework of actions that respond to the challenge in all its complexity. Furthermore, these accelerating policies have a medium and long-term vision and must have a great capacity for transformation and multiple impact, affecting several goals and objectives of the 2030 Agenda.



Sustainable Development Strategy 2030: public consultations

Identification of strategic challenges, accelerating policies and priority actions

Private Sector Consultation for the elaboration of the Sustainable Development Strategy

Between July and November, the Integral Consultation of the Business Sector took place, co-organized with the Spanish Network of the United Nations Global Compact, in which participated more than 1,900 companies of different sizes and types, with practically all productive sectors represented.


Social Movements Forum

Between September and October, a participatory process was carried out to gather their contributions, as fundamental agents and drivers of change and transformation.

Childhood and Adolescence Consultation

The Secretary of State for the 2030 Agenda promoted, together with UNICEF Spain, a consultation with children and adolescents to find out their concerns and integrate them into the 2030 Sustainable Development Strategy.

For this purpose, in October 2020, different working sessions were held within the framework of the VI State Meeting of Local Participation Councils, in which 192 children and adolescents between 8 and 17 years of age participated, representing 74 local participation councils.

- » Coverage of protected areas in relation to marine areas.
- » Proportion of sites important for terrestrial and freshwater biodiversity included in protected areas.
- » Population trends of common birds.
- » Area of forest as a proportion of total area.
- » Forest area with current sustainable forest management planning instrument in place in: .1 hectares, .2 %.
- » Annual average over the last decade of the proportion of forest area burned by forest fires as a proportion of total forest area.
- » Proportion of water bodies of good quality.
- » Degree of integrated water resources management
- » WEI+ exploitation rate
- » Annual average levels of fine particulate matter (e.g. PM2.5 and PM10) in cities (weighted by population).
- » Spanish Circular Economy Strategy Indicators.

ACCELERATING POLICY

3. Free and Equal Lives for All:

- » AROPE RATE–Population at risk of poverty or social exclusion, broken down by sex.
- » Employment rates by age group and education levels. Gender gap.
- » Unemployment rate by age group and education levels. Gender gap.
- » Long-term unemployed by age group and sex.
- » Share of part-time and temporary contract workers by gender.
- » Men and women living in households with very low labour intensity by age group.
- » Inactive persons according to reasons for inactivity and age groups by sex.
- » Persons not seeking employment due to caring for dependants by reason, age group and sex.
- » Gender pay gap (not adjusted for individual characteristics) in hourly wage, age, and period.
- » Gender pay gap (not adjusted for individual characteristics) in hourly wages by nature of employer (public/private sector) and period.
- » Annual salary percentiles. Women's wages relative to men's by period.
- » Relative income of the elderly. Gender gap.
- » Percentage of female students in science and technology in bachillerato (post-compulsory secondary education).
- » Percentage of female students in university degrees linked to STEAM studies.
- » Percentage of female students in higher vocational training cycles linked to STEAM studies.
- » Proportion of time spent on unpaid domestic and care work, broken down by sex, age and location.
- » Employed persons, average time spent on different activities, by sex.
- » Employed persons, care of dependent persons, by sex.
- » Proportion of women and girls aged 15 and over who have experienced physical, sexual, or psychological violence at the hands of a current or former intimate partner in the last 12 months, by form of violence and age.
- » Proportion of women and girls aged 15 and over who experienced sexual violence at the hands of a non-partner in the last 12 months, by age and place of occurrence.
- » Fatalities due to gender violence.
- » Proportion of seats held by women in a) national parliaments (Congress and Senate) and b) local governments (councils, mayors, and councillors).
- » Proportion of women in management positions, broken down by type of position: senior management, board members, entrepreneur women.
- » Proportion of the population reporting having felt personally discriminated against or harassed in the last 12 months on grounds of discrimination prohibited by international human rights law, disaggregated by sex.
- » Evolution of hate crimes, by type of crime and sex.





How does it contribute to the work of local authorities and their commitment to the citizens?

- Designing local public policies taking into account a **more comprehensive and rights-based approach**.
- Facilitating the **recovery, implementation or deepening of pre-existing planning processes** from a greater awareness of the interrelationships and the effects that different policies may have.
- Redirecting the formulation of **medium- and long-term goals** in accordance with the local challenges and issues to be addressed.
- Promoting the **prioritisation and monitoring of policies**.
- Facilitating the **monitoring of public policies and the measurement of results** that are already consolidated.
- Promoting the **articulation of local policies at the provincial, regional, national and international levels**.
- Incorporating the **three dimensions of sustainable development** (economic, social and environmental) in


the design and implementation of local policies.

- Enabling the focused implementation of **specific actions for individuals and groups in conditions of greater vulnerability and exclusion**.
- Promoting **active listening to other voices** during the process, beyond the public sphere, and the **mobilisation** of stakeholders such as civil society and academia, so they may contribute to the 2030 Agenda from their fields of action.
- **Raising public awareness** of the importance of adopting more sustainable lifestyles **and empowering citizens** to promote and demand that governments make a strong commitment to the 2030 Agenda .
- To foster the **mobilisation of the business sector and other stakeholders towards collaboration, co-creation and innovation for sustainable and inclusive development**.

CALL 2021 FOR GRANTS FOR ACTIVITIES RELATED TO THE PROMOTION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 2030 AGENDA FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT IN SPAIN

Subsidies to Social Entities

- ✓ 10 Millions Euros to finance projects and initiatives to promote and align social projects to public policies, as well as carrying out activities for the strengthening and implementation of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
- ✓ Beneficiaries: Around 60 associations, foundations, universities and other private non-profit entities, as well as universities.

Subsidies to Local Entities

- ✓ 6 Millions Euros, to finance projects and initiatives in municipalities, provinces and islands for implementing local plans on 2030 Agenda.
- ✓ Beneficiaries: Over 30 local entities in 2022, about 60 expected in 2023.
