## Localising the 2030 Agenda

### Working on and into (INSTITUTIONAL) COOPERATION

#### (vertical)

Agreements to enhance **collaboration** and guarantee "**visible shared endorsement**" + accompanyment to boost SD strategies at different territorial level

#### (horizontal)

**Governance mechanisms for SD** to promote awareness, collaboration and joint solutions (stop "reinventing the wheel" – ease ordinary tasks)

#### Creating an "activators network"

**Thematic groups** for discussing and **delivering shared methods and tools** - transversal/integrated issues to prioritize territorial SD strategies (address challenges and integrated field of policy – towards the 6 transitions)

**Stakeholder engagement** (multilevel – no duplication – trust)

#### Engage the academia into the challenge

to **support territorial institutions** and integrate point of view into thematic issues (dedicated funding – tailoring of available resources)


### **PCSD** for territories

Political committment + coherence tools. Objectives: institutionalization of PCSD and concrete instruments for policy Integration. *OECD Recomendation 1* 

#### POLICY FINANCING AND IMPACTS

Sustainability Dashboard. OECD Recomendation 3

#### **INSTITUTIONAL MECHANISMS**

Mechanisms for whole-of-government, multi-level, multi-stakeholders interaction. Objectives: working habits and «places» for enacting SDGs integrated and partecipatory programming. *OECD Recomendation 2* 




PCSD NAP is the **implementation tool** of the NSDS allowing for integrated programming and integrated monitoring.

## G7 Climate, Energy and Environment Ministers' Meeting Communiqué

(Torino, 29-30 April 2024)

(Italian Presidency)

- Localization is widely recognized as the critical approach to achieving the SDGs and their targets by 2030.
- A **gap** exists between the global acknowledgment of localization and its translation into action and practical support at the country and city level.
- Need to gather the relevant experiences and practices generated at the country level and connect them with the existing global initiatives on localizing the SDGs (G20 PLIC and the Local 2030 Coalition)
- Need to operationalize the priorities of the G20 and G7 Presidencies and to advancing the implementation of the Resolution on Localizing the SDGs
- Need for operational, technical and financial support to the localization of the SDGs by facilitating public-private partnerships within the Global South


