Fulfilling basic needs

Universal Basic Services

- Collectively generated activities that serve the public interest, essential and sufficient to enable people to meet their needs, where everyone is entitled to services that meet their needs without requirement to pay
- Healthcare, child and elderly-care, education, housing, transport, information technology, energy, etc.
- Reduce inequality, have long-term social returns on investment, promote solidarity and sustainability
- An alternative to Universal Basic Income (UBI), unconditional cash transfers



Fulfilling basic needs

Minimum Income Schemes

- Means-tested and needs-based social assistance benefits that provide a safety net for those in and out of work who lack access to unemployment benefits
- · Mitigate economic hardship and ensure a decent minimum standard of living
- Already exist in all EU MS and other countries, but often inadequate
- Need to be set at a level at or above the poverty threshold and to be inclusive, and can benefit those facing financial insecurity and discrimination
- Council Recommendation on MIS 2023 → Directive?



Engaging in the world of work

Job Guarantee

- Intervention by the state to interrupt long spells of joblessness, by offering a direct job and wage to those seeking but unable to find remunerative work
- <u>Voluntary</u> scheme that comes instead of unemployment or other social benefits, for those who want to engage in work as a means to social inclusion, fulfilment, skill development
- Often aimed at generating public benefit to communities, so can have social, environmental and economic benefits, and contribute to ensuring a just transition



Engaging in the world of work

Workplace Democracy

- Democratic involvement and participation of workers and oversight in their workplaces
- Structures for workers to be represented, informed and consulted on company decisions, and be able to participate meaningfully
- Different structures exist in MS and there is a Directive on information and consultation, but often not sufficient

 JT Legal Framework?
- Participation empowers workers and fosters democratic values, promotes better outcomes for workers, as well as social and environmental sustainability
